Two surprise packages arrived at the Austin Whittemore House this past year.

The first contained an autograph book owned by Miss Annie Ross and dating back to 1885. Many names of early Vermillion residents signed the little book. This little treasure was sent to the Clay County Historical Society by Marlene Jakoubek of Hermann, Missouri. She had found the book at a yard sale in Hermann and wanted to return it to its home.

The second came to us wrapped in tissue paper with a beautiful ribbon tied around it. This is another beautiful treasure from the 1890's. The gift was from Barbara Mellers of Santa Fe, New Mexico. She is a collector of family photo albums and found this album at an estate sale. She felt it should be returned to its homeland since many beautiful wedding photos were taken by local studios in Vermillion and Elk Point. The outside of the album is in mint condition. We only wish the names of the people were on the photos.

The Historical Society is very grateful to the ladies who searched us out and returned the items to their place of beginning. People who appreciate preserving the history for future generations are many times very helpful to local families. We thank them for their kindness.

LOG CABIN SCHOOLHOUSE

The Clay County Historical Preservation Commission (CCHPC) has teamed up with the Clay County Historical Society (CCHS) in an effort to get the old log cabin schoolhouse listed on either the State or National Register of Historic Places.

Throughout its history in four different locations, the old log schoolhouse has served to help educate the citizens and school children of Vermillion and the surrounding area. When Dr. W.H. Over came up with this idea in 1938, it brought together everyone in the community, including the instructors and students at the University of South Dakota, the businesspeople of Vermillion who donated money for the projects, and prominent citizens of the city who served on the committee. Ever since then, the building has remained intact, although relocated many times and repaired to look like new each time it was moved. As Vermillion was the site of the first permanent schoolhouse in Dakota Territory and Rachael Ross (Austin) was one of the first teachers, it is only just that the old log schoolhouse finally be given a permanent home on the SW corner of the Austin-Whittemore property. Both the Clay County Historic Preservation Commission and Clay County Historical Society will take part in this project to once again give Vermillion's students the opportunity to learn about the early education history of the city and what it was like to attend class in a one room log cabin schoolhouse.

NEWS FROM THE W.H. OVER MUSEUM

The South Dakota Quilt Documentation Project chairman, Mary Fitzgerald, will be conducting a Documentation Day for Vermillion on May 14 and 15. The hours will be from 10:00 a.m-5-:00 p.m. on May 14 and on May 15 from 1:00-4:30 p.m.

The purpose of the project is to record quilts completed in South Dakota before 1970. The identification and history of the quilter/s will be included as a tool for examining the contribution and place of women in our territorial and state history. Photographs and biographical information about the quilter is welcome. The information collected will be archived at the State Museum in Pierre and will be available for future research.

From the River Valleys to the Rising Bluff ... A Pictorial History of Vermillion, South Dakota 1859-2009

304 pages. This publication was sponsored by the Clay County Historical Society, Inc. for the Vermillion Sesquicentennial in 2009. The book conveys Vermillion's history through pictures and text.
